

Life Skills (#001)

(unleveled/graded, one year, 6 periods, 1.0 credit, grades 9-12)

This class will prepare students to work in a variety of settings. Food preparation, bakery procedures and management skills to be learned as follows: sanitation, safety, measurements, cold preparations, meal presentation, bread, cake and cookie production. Students will also learn basic laundry care and maintenance of the home.

Business/Work Experience (#002)

(unleveled/graded, one semester, 2-3 periods, 1-2 credits, grades 11-12) School-to-Work
Prerequisite: Students must be on Man of Honor in the program.

The semester will include projects with topics covering job search methods, filling out applications, the job interview, appropriate dress and hygiene, vocational counseling, develop appropriate attitudes and social skills necessary to perform in today's job market. Each student will hold a paid position covered under Worker's Compensation in a local business and be responsible for transportation and work scheduling.

(Minimum of ten (10) hours per week).

Wood Sculpture (#003)

(unleveled/graded, one semester, 2-3 periods, 0.5 credit, grades 9-12)

This course introduces the students to the basics of wood grain knowledge and wood sculpting tools. Each student will complete 2 projects per 0.5 credit offered. Students will also learn proper care and maintenance of tools.

Fingerstyle Guitar (#004)

(unleveled/graded, one semester, 2-3 periods, 0.5 credit, grades 9-12)

This course introduces the students to the basic knowledge of fingerstyle blues guitar playing. Text: *Beginning Fingerstyle Blues Guitar*, Arlen Roth.

Auto Restoration (#005)

(unleveled/graded, one year, 3 periods, 1.0 credit, grades 9-12)

This course is a one year class designed to take the students through a complete auto restoration process. This is a "frame off" restoration. The process includes: engine and transmission rebuild, interior restoration, auto body and paint, chassis repair, fine tuning and reassembly.

Worldview (#006)

(unleveled/graded, one year, 6 periods, 1.0 credit, grades 9-12)

This class challenges the students current view of the world through several mediums. Both a group counseling format as well as a video presentation are included in the course.

Text: *Biblical Solutions to Life's Problems*, Dr. Wayne Mack, Joshua Mack.

Understanding Biblical Doctrine-A Workbook in Theology, Crown and Covenant Publications.

Spanish 1 (#007)

(level 1, full year, 5 periods, 1 credit, grades 9-12)

The emphasis of this course is to immerse the student in listening and speaking the language through the medium of the diglot weave method. Text: *Powerglide*

Spanish 2 (#008)

(level 2, full year, 5 periods, 1 credit, grades 9-12)

Prerequisite: Spanish 1

The emphasis of this course is the continuation of Spanish 1 and the continued immersion of the student in the Spanish language. Once again the useage of the diglot weave is employed.

Construction (#009)

(level 2, full year, 5 periods, 1-2 credits, grades 9-12)

The carpentry course provides students with the means to develop their maximum potential by practicing skills and related trade knowledge that will enable them to enter industry as a skilled laborer. Student's skills develop progressively with the use of and and power tools used in modern construction techniques.

Classic Car Restoration (#010)

(level 2, full year, 5 periods, 1-2 credits, grades 9-12)

This course exposes students to complete antique car restoration. A frame-off ecinque is taught. Students will learn the full range of skills needed as well as a cursory study of the current market trends in collectible cars.

Masonry (#011)

(level 2, full year, 5 periods, 1-2 credits, grades 9-12)

This course introduced the students to the skills needed to "tend" a brick or stone mason. Skills such as supplying the mason and mixing the cement are taught, as well as the proper "finishing" of masonry work.

Auto Detail (#012)

(level 2, full year, 5 periods, 1 credit, grades 9-12)

This class is an introduction to starting one's own business in the car detailing business. Students learn the needed skills of hustling business as well as the "eye for detail" to wash and detail a car. This includes: engine cleaning, interior, minor scratches, and tire work.

Auto Body (#013)

(level 2, full year, 5 periods, 1-2 credits, grades 9-12)

In this course the student will learn the fine art of body work and painting of the automobile. Skills including (but not limited to)the following will be taught: sanding, airbrush painting, color sanding, clear coat painting, buffing, and presentation.

Engine and Transmission Repair (#014)

(level 2, full year, 5 periods, 1-2 credits, grades 9-12)

In this course the student will learn the basics of diagnostic engine and transmission repair. Both manual and standard transmission work is included. The exposure depends upon the current customers.

Home Flooring (#015)

(level 2, full year, 5 periods, 1-2 credits, grades 9-12)

In this course students will learn the basics skills needed to lay the following floor types: carpet, tile, linoleum, and wood flooring. Some exposure to counter tops in also common.

Heating and Air Conditioning (#016)

(level 2, full year, 5 periods, 1-2 credits, grades 9-12)

This course will expose the students to all sorts of heating and air conditioning installation and repair work. The students will also learn fabrication techniques.

General Maintenance (#017)

(level 2, full year, 5 periods, 1-2 credits, grades 9-12)

In this course the student will “shadow” the owner of a local bed and breakfast resort. The student will learn general repair and upkeep of the rental units. A good working knowledge of lawn and garden tools will also be included.

Scuba Diving (#018)

(level 2, full year, 5 periods, 1-2 credits, grades 9-12)

Students will apprentice in a local dive-shop. General store duties will be taught as well as giving the student opportunity to continue or begin their hours toward master diver certification.

Animal Control (#019)

(level 2, full year, 5 periods, 1-2 credits, grades 9-12)

In this course the student will accompany the local animal control officer as he does his duties. Students will learn the basics to animal control as well as restraint methods commonly used.

Veterinary Science (#020)

(level 2, full year, 5 periods, 1 credit, grades 9-12)

Students will work in a local animal hospital as a technician’s assistant. Students will learn the requirements to be and animal health technician as well as the other skills needed to be help in the office.

Pottery (#021)

(level 2, full year, 5 periods, 1 credit, grades 9-12)

Pottery is an exploration of three-dimensional space, form, and texture. Students will work from observation and also create abstract work. Students will also learn the working mechanisms of a kiln.

Physical Education (#022)

(levels 1,2,3,4 full year, 5 periods, 1 credit, grades 9-12)

Students will be introduced to the fundamental skills and the rules and regulations of a number of varied team activities. They are also involved in a running and weight lifting regime.

Fire Science (#023)

(levels 1,2,3,4 full year, 5 period, 1 credit, grades 9-12)

Students will be introduced to life in a fire station and do ride-along with the local fire department. They will be given a general knowledge of fire science basics.
